# **HAITI** Knights of Columbus Help Reintegrate Earthquake Victims



Smiles and waves from everywhere!

On January 12, 2010 a massive earthquake struck Haiti. It was estimated that between 2,000 and 4,000 instant amputees were created from serious physical injuries sustained during the initial destruction. In the days following the earthquake, hospitals were still performing another 30 - 100 amputations per day each, and even now amputations are still routinely performed due to secondary infections from injuries. These staggering

numbers are in addition to the 800,000 people estimated by Haiti International to have already been living with disabilities in the country prior to the earthquake.

Within days of the earthquake, the Knights of Columbus committed to sponsoring 1,000 wheelchairs and on April 27th, 2010, Supreme Knight Carl Anderson, along with Knights from Saskatchewan and several other States and representatives of the Canadian Wheelchair Foundation travelled to Port-au-Prince, Haiti, to deliver these gifts of hope and independence. In surveying the situation at the field hospital and around the city, Supreme Knight Carl Anderson remarked that "though time has dimmed the memory of the tragic earthquake in Haiti for many who live elsewhere, the physical

suffering of those injured in the earthquake and here in Port-au-Prince continues in a very real way. We are grateful for the opportunity to give the gift of mobility to those who need it most".



# CUBA Hope for Citizens of Cuba and Knights alike

In March 2010, members of the Manitoba Knights of Columbus Manitoba travelled to Cuba with the Canadian Wheelchair Foundation to deliver mobility in Havana and Camagüey.

The visit was a journey of the heart for PSD Larry Kustra and his wife Margaret, an opportunity to personally witness the delivery of the wheelchairs sponsored by councils across Manitoba, but also to finally meet members of the only council in Cuba who were able to attend last year's Supreme Convention in Quebec

City with the help of the Manitoba State Council.

Everyone was so touched and impressed by the immense dedication of all representatives of Caritas, the CWF's partner in Cuba, who operate an amazing array of programs to help families and those with developmental and physical challenges in delicate political and difficult financial circumstances. Many of their current volunteers are still Squires from before the revolution, hoping and praying to be Knights soon.

Delivering half the wheelchairs in cooperation with a government operated community centre in Old Havana enabled Caritas and the visitors to personally visit homes of those in need. Bringing one wheelchair at a time up narrow steps or ancient

elevators, into tiny apartments in previously rambling villas, now occupied by many families, and seeing the warmth, gratitude and happiness in every home, in every family, gave a small indication of how desperately this help was needed.

The last day brought PSD Larry a touching surprise: almost all Cuban Knights and their families gathered after mass in honour of him and his Manitoba brothers, thanking them for their generous donation. It was clear that the Canadian Knights had also delivered hope for a better future - for the citizens of Cuba and for the future of its Knights.
